

WSTLUR 2020 Paper Submission Guide

Thank you for considering presenting at the World Symposium on Transport and Land Use Research (WSTLUR) in Portland, Oregon USA from 13-16 July 2020. We are looking for original submissions that fall either under one of the conference themes or in the area of transport and land use in general.

Original submissions can fall under five submission types, including Articles, Correspondence, Methods, Viewpoints, and Discussions, as a way to better engage a diverse audience. Because these submission types are intrinsically different and come with varying manuscript lengths, please see the descriptions of each submission type below.

Articles

Articles and manuscripts report original data analysis and advance theory or methods (including applying methods in novel ways or to new questions), respond to one or two questions, and typically are more than 2,000 words (4,000-10,000 words is common, but there is no specific word count).

Correspondence

Correspondence (letters) briefly document original data analysis (most frequently using established methods and testing previously proposed theories; generally under 2,000 words).

Methods

Methods present a new experimental or statistical method, test or procedure (e.g., GIS protocols or web interfaces), generally using established datasets. The method described may either be completely new, or may improve existing techniques. These are generally under 2,000 words.

Viewpoints

Viewpoints (commentaries or debates) present an argument that is not necessarily based on practical research. Debate articles can report on all aspects of the subject including theoretical, sociological and ethical aspects. Viewpoint and commentary focus and opine on specific issues within the journal's scope and are about 1,000 words.

Discussions

Discussions (provide opinions, reactions, judgments of importance, and links/connections to other ideas and subfields) comment on previously published papers, which may be accompanied by a response from the original author.
